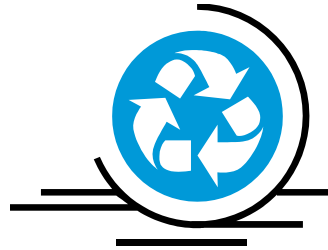


# Cumberland County Recycling & Disposal Guide: A to Z

Item	Curbside Trash/Recycling Options	Drop-Off Trash/Recycling Options
<b>A</b>		
Air Conditioners	May be able to set out as a bulk item on trash collection day – <a href="#">contact your municipality and/or waste collector</a> .	Contact an <a href="#">appliance recycler</a> or <a href="#">scrap recycler</a> to see if they will accept.
Aluminum	Aluminum cans should be placed in your recycling bin. DO NOT place aluminum scrap in recycling bin.	Aluminum scrap (and even aluminum cans) can be taken to a <a href="#">scrap recycler</a> .
Ammunition	DO NOT place ammunition in trash or recycling.	Try contacting your local police department or a shooting/sportsmen's club.
Antifreeze	Not regulated if from a private home; therefore, may be disposed of with trash. Absorb into vermiculite, cat litter, saw dust or other absorbent material. Divide larger quantities and dispose of them over several collection periods.	Some <a href="#">businesses do accept antifreeze</a> for recycling – contact for details. Antifreeze is also accepted at the County's <a href="#">annual HHW event</a> .
Appliances Containing Freon	May be able to set out as a bulk item on trash collection day – <a href="#">contact your municipality and/or waste collector</a> .	Contact an <a href="#">appliance recycler</a> or <a href="#">scrap recycler</a> to see if they will accept.
Appliances Not Containing Freon	May be able to set out as a bulk item on trash collection day – <a href="#">contact your municipality and/or waste collector</a> .	Contact a <a href="#">scrap recycler</a> to see if they will accept.
Asbestos	Not regulated if from a private home; therefore, may be disposed of with trash. Personal Protective Equipment is recommended when handling asbestos. Securely bag before placing in the trash.	May be taken directly to a <a href="#">disposal facility</a> – fees apply. Use same precautionary measures as for curbside disposal.

Ashes	May be disposed of with trash. Allow ashes to cool in a non-combustible container for several days before placing in the trash. Should be bagged. If bag melts, ashes are too hot.	May be taken directly to a <a href="#">disposal facility</a> – fees apply. Use same precautionary measures as for curbside disposal.
Asphalt, Brick, Concrete, & Gravel	Due to irregular shapes and quantities, curbside collection programs generally just say NO Construction & Demolition Waste with your trash. If you only have a very small quantity and small pieces that can easily fit in a trash bag with other trash, you might consider mixing it in.	Large quantity / large pieces – take directly to a <a href="#">disposal facility</a> , hire someone to take it, or rent a <a href="#">dumpster from a waste collection company</a> . Search local Craigslist for possible "fill wanted" locations as this would be considered clean fill.
Audio and Videotapes, CDs, DVDs & Records	May be disposed of with trash. DO NOT put in your curbside recycling bin.	CDs and DVDs are accepted for recycling at <a href="#">Best Buy</a> stores. <a href="#">New Hope Recycling</a> accepts audio and videotapes for recycling.
<b>B</b>		
Batteries - Alkaline and Zinc Carbon Batteries (A, AA, AAA, C, D, 9V)	May be disposed of with trash. DO NOT put in your curbside recycling bin.	<a href="#">Batteries + Bulbs</a> in Camp Hill accepts alkaline batteries for recycling for a fee. <a href="#">New Hope Recycling</a> accepts alkaline batteries for recycling.
Batteries - Button Cell	May be disposed of with trash. DO NOT put in your curbside recycling bin.	May be brought to County's <a href="#">annual HHW event</a> .
Batteries - Lead Acid Batteries (Car, Boat, Motorcycle, Emergency Lighting, Alarm Systems etc.)	Not recommended.	Retail outlets that sell <a href="#">car batteries</a> must accept used car batteries for recycling. May also be brought to County's <a href="#">annual HHW event</a> .
Batteries - Rechargeable Batteries (Cell phone, Laptop, Camera, Power Tool, Camcorder etc.)	Not recommended.	Some retailers have <a href="#">Call2Recycle</a> collection boxes for rechargeable batteries as part of a battery product stewardship program.
Books (soft cover)	May be placed directly in your recycling bin.	A few <a href="#">drop boxes for books</a> exist in the County.

Books (hard cover)	May be placed in regular trash. DO NOT place in recycling bin unless the hard cover and binding have been removed.	A few <a href="#">drop boxes for books</a> exist in the County. <a href="#">Chambersburg Waste Paper</a> accepts hard cover books for recycling.
<b>C</b>		
Cardboard	May be placed in recycling bin – should be sized to fit.	May be taken to a <a href="#">recycling drop-off facility</a> . <a href="#">Project SHARE</a> in Carlisle also accepts cardboard for recycling.
Carpet	May be able to set out as a bulk item on trash collection day – <a href="#">contact your municipality and/or waste collector</a> .	May be taken directly to a <a href="#">disposal facility</a> – fees apply.
Cartons (Waxed)	<a href="#">Penn Waste</a> and <a href="#">Waste Management</a> accept cartons for recycling in curbside recycling bins. May be placed in regular trash if not accepted where you live.	Might be accepted at a <a href="#">recycling drop-off facility</a> – contact for confirmation.
Cell Phones	May be disposed in the trash. DO NOT place in recycling bin.	Many retailers accept rechargeable batteries and cell phones for recycling through the <a href="#">Call2Recycle</a> program.
Christmas Trees	Some municipalities collect Christmas trees – <a href="#">contact your municipality</a> .	Can be taken to a <a href="#">municipal compost site</a> if available where you live. There are a few <a href="#">private yard waste recycling sites</a> in the region – fees may apply.
Clothing and Textiles	May be disposed in the trash. DO NOT place in recycling bin.	There are many clothing collection bins scattered throughout the County.
Computers	Banned from curbside trash disposal. DO NOT place in recycling bin.	There are a few <a href="#">computer recycling drop-off locations</a> (NO TVs) in the County.
Concrete	See Asphalt, Brick, Concrete, & Gravel.

If you only have a very small quantity and small pieces that can easily fit in a trash bag with other trash, you might consider mixing it in.	May be taken directly to a <a href="#">disposal facility</a> that accepts C&D waste – fees apply.
Cooking Oil	May be disposed of with trash. Absorb into vermiculite, cat litter, saw dust or other absorbent material. Divide larger quantities and dispose over several collection periods.	Search local Craigslist for people looking for used cooking oil.
Couches	May be able to set out as a bulk item on trash collection day – <a href="#">contact your municipality and/or waste collector</a> .	May be taken directly to a <a href="#">disposal facility</a> – fees apply.

Dehumidifier	May be able to set out as a bulk item on trash collection day – <a href="#">contact your municipality and/or waste collector</a> .	Contact an <a href="#">appliance recycler</a> or <a href="#">scrap recycler</a> to see if they will accept.
Driveway Sealer	Not regulated if from a private home; therefore, may be disposed of with trash. Absorb into vermiculite, cat litter, saw dust or other absorbent material. Divide larger quantities and dispose over several collection periods.	A <a href="#">disposal facility</a> should accept from a homeowner if dried – fees apply.

Drywall	Due to irregular shapes and quantities, curbside collection programs generally just say NO Construction & Demolition Waste with your trash. If you only have a very small quantity and small pieces that can easily fit in a trash bag with other trash, you might consider mixing it in.	Large quantity / large pieces – take directly to a <a href="#">disposal facility</a> , hire someone to take it, or rent a <a href="#">dumpster from a waste collection company</a> .
<b>E</b>		
Electronic Equipment	Computer equipment and televisions are banned from trash disposal by <a href="#">PA law</a> . It is legal to place other types of electronics in the trash. DO NOT place in recycling bin.	A few retailers still accept <a href="#">computer and other electronic equipment</a> (NO TVs) for recycling. Check with the retailer for details.
<b>F</b>		
Fire Extinguishers	May be disposed of with regular trash as long as all pressure has been released. DO NOT place in recycling bin.	Some <a href="#">fire extinguishers</a> are rechargeable. Check the yellow pages under Fire Extinguisher Service. May also be brought to <a href="#">annual HHW event</a> .
Flares	May be disposed of with regular trash but should first be soaked in a pail of water for several days.	Try contacting your local fire department.
Fluorescent Lights and Ballasts	Not regulated if from a private home; therefore, may be disposed of with trash. DO NOT place in recycling bin.	Some retailers accept <a href="#">compact fluorescent bulbs</a> for recycling. Fluorescent bulbs and tubes may be brought to County's <a href="#">annual HHW event</a> . Ballasts with PCB oil in them are also accepted at the <a href="#">HHW event</a> .

Fuels & Solvents	Not regulated if from a private home; therefore, may be disposed of with trash. Absorb into vermiculite, cat litter, saw dust or other absorbent material. Divide larger quantities and dispose over several collection periods.	May be brought to County's <a href="#">annual HHW event</a> .
Furniture	May be able to set out as a bulk item on trash collection day – <a href="#">contact your municipality and/or waste collector</a> .	May be taken directly to a <a href="#">disposal facility</a> – fees apply.
<b>G</b>		
Gasoline	Not regulated if from a private home; therefore, may be disposed of with trash. Absorb into vermiculite, cat litter, saw dust or other absorbent material. Divide larger quantities and dispose over several collection periods.	May be brought to County's <a href="#">annual HHW event</a> .
Glass	Clear, brown and green glass bottles and jars can be placed in your recycling bin. DO NOT put other types of glass (i.e. window panes, mirrors, light bulbs) in your recycling bin.	Clear, brown and green glass bottles and jars may be taken to a <a href="#">recycling drop-off facility</a> .
Grocery Bags	DO NOT put in curbside recycling bin.	Several retailers accept <a href="#">plastic bags</a> for recycling.

Helium Tanks	Follow these <a href="#">instructions</a> and place in recycling bin.	Follow these <a href="#">instructions</a> and take to <a href="#">scrap recycler</a> that will accept.

Humidifier	May be able to set out as a bulk item on trash collection day – <a href="#">contact your municipality and/or waste collector</a> .	Contact a <a href="#">scrap recycler</a> to see if they will accept. If not, may be taken directly to a <a href="#">disposal facility</a> – fees apply.

Ink Cartridges	May be disposed of in regular trash. DO NOT place in recycling bin.	Ink cartridges can be dropped off at <a href="#">Staples</a> , <a href="#">Best Buy</a> , and <a href="#">Target</a> for recycling.
Insulation	See Construction & Demolition Materials.	
<b>J</b>		
Junk Mail	Junk Mail can be placed in curbside recycling bin.	May be taken to a <a href="#">recycling drop-off facility</a> .
<b>K</b>		
Kerosene	Not regulated if from a private home; therefore, may be disposed of with trash. Absorb into vermiculite, cat litter, saw dust or other absorbent material. Divide larger quantities and dispose over several collection periods.	May be brought to County's <a href="#">annual HHW event</a> .

Light Bulbs	Homeowners may place light bulbs in regular trash. DO NOT place in recycling bin.	Some retailers accept <a href="#">compact fluorescent bulbs</a> for recycling. Fluorescent bulbs and tubes may be brought to County's <a href="#">annual HHW event</a> .
Lumber	Due to irregular shapes and quantities, curbside collection programs generally just say NO Construction & Demolition Waste with your trash. If you only have a very small quantity and small pieces that can easily fit in a trash bag with other trash, you might consider mixing it in.	May be taken directly to a <a href="#">disposal facility</a> that accepts C&D waste – fees apply.
<b>M</b>		
Medicine - Liquid	Mix with an unpalatable substance such as dirt, kitty litter, or used coffee grounds, place the mixture in a sealed plastic bag, and place in regular trash. Remove personal information from plastic bottles and place empty bottles in recycling bin.	NO
Medicine - Pills	Mix with an unpalatable substance such as dirt, kitty litter, or used coffee grounds, place the mixture in a sealed plastic bag, and place in regular trash. Remove personal information from plastic bottles and place empty bottles in recycling bin.	Several <a href="#">medication collection boxes</a> are located around the County for the collection of old pills.
Mercury (thermometers)	Not regulated if from a private home; therefore, may be disposed of with trash. DO NOT place in recycling bin.	May be brought to County's <a href="#">annual HHW event</a> .

Find a mercury thermostat collection location offered by the <a href="#">Thermostat Recycling Corporation</a> (entire thermostat must be turned in, not just the bulb with mercury). May be brought to County's <a href="#">annual HHW event</a> .
Metal & Scrap	DO NOT place scrap metal in your recycling bin.	Contact a <a href="#">scrap recycler</a> to see if they will accept.
Microwaves	May be able to set out as a bulk item on trash collection day – <a href="#">contact your municipality and/or waste collector</a> .	Contact a <a href="#">scrap recycler</a> to see if they will accept.
Motor Oil	Not regulated if from a private home; therefore, may be disposed of with trash. Absorb into vermiculite, cat litter, saw dust or other absorbent material. Divide larger quantities and dispose over several collection periods. DO NOT pour directly onto the ground.	Several retailers accept uncontaminated <a href="#">motor oil</a> (new or used) for recycling.

Absorb into vermiculite, cat litter, saw dust or other absorbent material. Divide larger quantities and dispose over several collection periods. Clean metal paint cans may be put in recycling bin.	<a href="#">Disposal facilities</a> should accept dried paint.
Paint - Oil Based	Not regulated if from a private home; therefore, may be disposed of with trash. Absorb into vermiculite, cat litter, saw dust or other absorbent material. Divide larger quantities and dispose of them over several collection periods. Clean metal paint cans may be put in recycling bin.	<a href="#">Disposal facilities</a> should accept dried paint. Oil based paint may be brought to the County's <a href="#">annual HHW event</a> .
Pallets	Due to irregular shapes and quantities, curbside collection programs generally just say NO Construction & Demolition Waste with your trash. If you only have a very small quantity and small pieces that can easily fit in a trash bag with other trash, you might consider mixing it in.	Use as wood for a camp fire. Take directly to a <a href="#">disposal facility</a> – fees apply. There are a few <a href="#">private wood waste recycling sites</a> in the region that might accept pallets for recycling – fees may apply.
Paper	Clean paper may be placed in your recycling bin.	May be taken to a <a href="#">recycling drop-off facility</a> .
Pesticides	Not regulated if from a private home; therefore, may be disposed of with trash. If liquid, absorb into vermiculite, cat litter, saw dust or other absorbent material. Divide larger quantities and dispose over several collection periods.	May be brought to County's <a href="#">annual HHW event</a> .

Plastic	The list of acceptable plastics has expanded over the years. Generally, plastic bottles, jugs and jars #1 through #7 can be placed in your recycling bin, but consider contacting your waste collector to see if they accept other types of plastic.	Plastic bottles, jugs and jars may be taken to a <a href="#">recycling drop-off facility</a> . Check with facility to see if they accept other types of plastic.
Plastic Bottle Caps	Some recyclers say to leave on, some say must take off; therefore, it is recommended you contact your recycler for specific instructions.	Some recyclers say to leave on, some say must take off; therefore, it is recommended you contact the <a href="#">recycling drop-off facility</a> for specific instructions.
Pool Chemicals	Not regulated if from a private home; therefore, may be disposed of with trash. Individually bag. Do not expose to water.	May be brought to County's <a href="#">annual HHW event</a> .
Propane Tanks	Small propane tanks (1 pounders) can be placed in the trash if <u>completely evacuated</u> . Divide larger quantities and dispose over several collection periods. Consider buying an adapter that allows you to refill them from a larger propane tank.	Contact a <a href="#">scrap recycler</a> to see if they will accept.
