Pollution Control Project Funded in Cumberland County

31 County Conservation Districts Received Funding to Promote Water Pollution Prevention Strategies across Pennsylvania

Carlisle, PA—Cumberland Conservation District received \$905.76 to hold 4 Conodoguinet Creek Snapshot Workshops on Nonpoint Source Pollution and Water Monitoring on the Conodoguinet Watershed.

“This grant allows our conservation district to address local pollution issues. We plan to educate local residents on how they can do their part to ensure there is clean water for future generations,” said Carl Goshorn, District Manager.

Education and outreach about the project(s) is expected to begin April 2017. The district expects to have the project work begin no later than June, 2017.
