Conodoguinet Creek Watershed Snapshot


Cumberland County, PA – The Cumberland County Conservation District is sponsoring a series of one-day events for volunteers to learn about Nonpoint Source Pollution and water quality in the Conodoguinet Creek Watershed. Volunteers will collect water samples and analyze the results. Water quality data will include pH, conductivity, temperature, Nitrogen and Phosphorus rates.

Volunteers should sign up for a sample site location **at least one week in advance** by visiting bit.ly/WatershedSnapshot. Volunteers will be provided with a sampling kit and information about their site. Participants are asked to bring their collected samples to the Alliance for Aquatic Resource Monitoring (ALLARM) at Dickinson College in Carlisle, or a designated drop off site, to analyze the sample.

All sampling events will be from 9a.m. to 12p.m at ALLARM's lab. Snapshot events are scheduled for July 8, September 30 and December 2, 2017, and March 3, 2018.

The sampling events are made possible by the Conservation District's partners: Big Spring Watershed Association, Conodoguinet Creek Watershed Association, Middle Spring Watershed Association, Environmental Protection Agency, Pennsylvania Association of Conservation Districts, and ALLARM.
