

PUBLIC SAFETY REVIEW TEAM MEETING

MINUTES

February 24, 2016

Cumberland County Department of Public Safety

The Cumberland County Board of Commissioners held a Public Safety Review Team Meeting on Wednesday, February 24, 2016, at 10:00 a.m. at the Department of Public Safety, Training Room B, 1 Public Safety Drive, Carlisle, PA. **Present:** Commissioners Vince DiFilippo, Jim Hertzler and Gary Eichelberger; Larry Thomas, Chief Clerk; Dana Best and Ron Snow, Finance; Holly Sherman, Human Resources; Megan Silverstrim, Communications; Bob Shively, Brian Hamilton, Claudia Garner, John Quirk, Michele Parsons, Public Safety.

Bob Shively welcomed everyone to the meeting and thanked them for attending today.

911 Operational Updates (John Quirk):

- **Staffing and Personnel Updates**— The part time dispatcher we hired has completed his call taker training and will advance to police dispatch training next week. His performance will be reviewed and assuming he continues in his success, our plan is to offer him the existing full time position. Once dispatcher Seth Munson transfers to his new position of Technical Systems Coordinator, that will create a vacancy in the Emergency Communications Center (ECC). The management team will be meeting tomorrow to develop the interview questions for the panel to conduct interviews of potential Quality Assurance Technician candidates. Once that candidate has been chosen, that will be another vacancy in the ECC to fill in the near future.

Technical Systems Updates (Brian Hamilton):

- **Police Dispatch Silent Dispatch/CAD Upgrade** - the xCAD upgrade project is running according to schedule. Design continues and workstations have been placed in the ECC with the plan to begin testing in mid-March. To ensure a smooth transition, a working group has been established which consists of members of the each of the ECC dispatch teams, DPS management, and some field users.
- **Future Radio System** – our staff is currently working on a presentation for the April 6, 2016 Finance meeting to provide the Board of Commissioners with a high level project scope of what the future of our radio system looks like, options currently available to us, high level costs, risks vs benefits, and key decision points for future planning. Regardless of what decisions are made for the radio system, we do have existing projects in the budget that will need action taken to ensure continuity of operations.
- **ECC Phone System Replacement** – as part of our capital project budgeting plan, we have begun the process to obtain cost estimates, risk vs benefit, and options for a new phone system in the ECC. We are exploring the opportunity of sharing the system capabilities with others in our region and perhaps be eligible for the 911 Uniform Funding 15% capital grant. More information will follow in the coming months.

Emergency Management Updates (Michele Parsons):

- **Snow Storm Event (Winter Storm Jonas)** – preliminarily expense documentation has been submitted for Cumberland County over a 2-day period was over \$1.1mil. To qualify for reimbursement the County must collectively meet a threshold of \$800K+, and this will add into the statewide calculation which has a threshold of \$18m. We have received confirmation that the Governor has submitted a request to the President to issue a Presidential Declaration. If a

declaration is issued, then we would host a meeting to explain the process to complete the required documentation for reimbursement. The Local Emergency Management Coordinator (LEMC) meeting was right after the storm and we took advantage of that to stress the importance of submitting preliminary numbers so that we can reach the initial threshold and reviewed the process that will follow to get reimbursed.

Commissioner Hertzler asked a question for Southampton Township, “*did they need to declare in order to submit?*” Michele Parsons advised, they did not have to declare, but if they have expenses they do need to submit their documentation. Michele Parsons will do a follow up with them to inquire if they need assistance or are choosing not to submit. Commissioner Hertzler also asked “*how many other townships did not submit?*” Michele Parsons will get that answer and provide to the Commissioners.

- **Rt 11/15 Closure Project** – there is a meeting with the contractor and emergency managers today to continue planning for the May 1st – August 1st closure. At this point we have been told if there is an emergency and the roadway would need reopened, it would take at least 8 hours to open just one lane. The previously identified emergency access route was going to be River Road, however publications have been sent out listing that as an alternative road for business access. The municipalities may consider implementing a weight restriction, but there is also a road space issue if you had large vehicles coming in opposing lanes. We have been working internally to identify potential risks, hazards, and options while developing contingency plans for such.
- **Hazmat Team certification** – certification will be this Friday
- **Team deployment** – The New Cumberland River Rescue is currently in Lycoming County searching for a missing person
- **EOC activations and trainings** – please see the attached report for details.

DPS Project Reports & Status Updates:

- **Snow Storm Appreciation** (Megan Silverstrim) – in any emergency there are individuals who go above and beyond to help render aid which was the case in our recent snow storm. We reached out to our public safety partners and local coordinators to seek nominations for such individuals to receive recognition they deserve. Positive feedback was widely received and we have a list of 10-15 people who have been nominated for three levels of appreciation: written letters of appreciation from Bob Shively, letter of appreciation from the Board of Commissioners, and recognition at a Commissioners meeting. Some of their actions include the donation of food, use of private snowmobiles to transport people, delivering medications, etc. Megan also suggested we could issue a general press release to thank the community for everyone who went above and beyond to help each other. Commissioner Eichelberger suggested a Commissioner actually attend the municipal meeting to issue the appreciation letters to the individuals.
- **Cumberland County Volunteer Firefighters Association CCVFFA** (Bob Shively) – at the request of CCVFFA President Jim Hoerner, our staff met with him on Monday evening to share information that has been developed thus far for the future of the Emergency Services Training Academy (ESTA) that wasn’t relayed to him. The Board of Commissioners is invited to attend their meeting on March 17th, 2016 at 1900 hrs in which DPS staff will share the PowerPoint presentation that was presented at the December Review Team meeting. Upon completion of this meeting presentation, each of the emergency services will have had opportunity to hear the options being presented and voice their concerns, suggestions, and potential solutions. The next step will be for the working group to reconvene and continue the momentum forward in determining the future of the ESTA property.

Finance, Contracts & Grants Management (Claudia Garner):

- **Emergency Management Performance Grant (EMPG)**: the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency (PEMA) application for FFY15-16 EMPG funding will be on the next

Commissioner's workshop agenda. This is an annual application for grant funding that is used to reimburse the General Fund for half of the Director and Emergency Operations salary & benefits. This year's submission is for \$99,945.

- **Phone Recovery Services Litigation:** the complaint was filed with a docket number assigned with the agency working with 8 other counties in Pennsylvania. Delaware County was the first county in PA to file a complaint on June 1, 2015 and a summary of their timeline of events was shared with us in which there have been preliminary objections and amendments back and forth (see attached).
- **911 Uniform Fund:** - With the new eligibility listing established with Act 12 of 2015, it has allowed us to utilize the deferred revenues to offset county subsidy in the last 5 months of 2015. By drawing down this deferred balance and the increase in surcharge fee to \$1.65, we had a remaining fund balance of \$2.8m. In Act 12 of 2015, it was written into the legislation that PEMA and the 911 Advisory Board would have the authorization to make changes. In the PEMA Information Bulletin 2016-1 issued on January 15, 2016, they made a change in how we can utilize the new 911 Uniform Funds. According to the bulletin, we are now able to use the funding and apply it toward ALL calendar year 2015 (CY15) eligible expenses vs solely for August-December expenses as originally directed. We did verify this with Jeff Boyle from PEMA yesterday. That being said, \$1.7m of our CY15 eligible expenses are eligible for the Uniform Funding and our recommendation is to set this money aside (in an assigned fund balance account) for future budgeted & planned projects to help offset future year's subsidy. We could use it to offset our subsidy drawn from the General Fund from CY15, however when the future planned projects occur there will be a steep increase in subsidy. Dana Best advised some of the capital projects in the future year's projections are taking place when the General Fund revenues will start naturally having impacts. She recommends setting these funds aside as well because these funds will no longer be restricted and are able to be applied to a broader scope of 911 expenses. All three Commissioners agreed with recommendation.

Good of the Group:

- **THANKS program** (Megan Silverstrim) – at the last Review Team meeting, Commissioner Hertzler requested a listing of the various businesses that were contacted about engaging in the THANKS program, their responses, and a copy of the letter that was sent. Copies (also attached) were given to each Commissioner to review and we will add the future of the program on the next meeting agenda.

PROGRESS UPDATE

On January 22, 2016, Cumberland County, Pennsylvania, by and through its counsel Dilworth Paxson LLP, filed a Complaint with the Cumberland County Prothonotary in the Court of Common Pleas against the following 22 named Defendants and all of their subsidiaries and related entities.

The Complaint seeks redress for the Defendants' intentional and/or knowing failure to charge, collect, report, and remit to the County 911 Assessments in excess of \$6,736,104 over the past six years, using conservative numbers, and more likely \$9,670,164, according to the County's best estimate based on currently available information.

The matter has been given Docket Number No. 2015-04281 and is awaiting judicial assignment. A copy of the filed Complaint can be found following this update.

PRS and Dilworth Paxson LLP are currently working with the following counties in Pennsylvania that have filed, or have approved the filing of Complaints (seeking similar redress) in their respective Court of Common Pleas: Beaver, Butler, Chester, Berks, Delaware, Dauphin, Washington and York. It is anticipated that an additional four to eight counties working with PRS & Dilworth Paxson LLP will be in position to file Complaints in the near future.

Delaware County, Pennsylvania was the initial County to file a Complaint and did so on June 1, 2015. What follows is a summary of events that have since occurred in that jurisdiction and are provided herein, as it would be unremarkable if the Defendants utilized this same strategy in Cumberland County. Subsequent to the Complaint being filed by the County, the Defendants filed Preliminary Objections rather than answer the Complaint. The County responded by filing an Answer in Opposition to the Defendants' Preliminary Objections and provided a Memorandum of Law in support thereof. On November 4, 2015 the Judge overruled the Defendants' Preliminary Objections.

However, rather than Answer the Complaint, the Defendants instead filed a motion asking the judge to reconsider his decision, or in the alternative permit an interlocutory appeal (or interim appeal) prior to having all of the claims resolved as to all parties. On December 11, 2015 the Judge denied both of these requests and ordered the Defendants to answer the County's Complaint.

On January 4, 2016, the County filed an Amended Complaint. Once again, rather than answer the Complaint as ordered by the Judge, the Defendants on February 1, 2016 again filed preliminary objections and a separate motion again asking for the matter to be certified for interlocutory appeal. At the time of this update Delaware County is making preparations to respond appropriately.
