Cumberland County Planning Commission Seeks New Member to Fill Vacancy

Carlisle, Pa. – The Cumberland County Planning Commission is seeking to fill a vacancy on the Commission for 2018. Residents interested in serving on the Commission must live in Cumberland County, and will need to complete an application and submit a one-page resume for consideration. The successful applicant will serve the remaining five months of the vacated position and then be eligible for reappointment to a full four year term starting in 2019. Applicants must be able to attend the Commission's monthly meetings at 7:30 a.m. on the third Thursday of each month.

A subcommittee of the Commission will review applications, conduct interviews, and recommend a slate of potential members to the Cumberland County Board of Commissioners, who make final appointment decisions. Experience in planning is helpful but not required. Appointments are made with respect to the applicants' interest in serving, background diversity and geography of residence.

Application materials are due to the Cumberland County Planning Commission office by June 30, 2018.
