County Commissioners Recognize 9-1-1 Dispatcher for Saving Newborn

Carlisle PA – The Cumberland County Commissioners today recognized Dispatcher Nicole Kepes, for saving a newborn during a 9-1-1 call from a Lemoyne resident who reported the infant choking on Monday, Sept. 10, 2018.

Kepes reported that the 14-day-old infant was choking and during the conversation the caller indicated the baby was not breathing. Kepes provided Emergency Medical Dispatch (EMD) instructions to help the caller until Emergency Medical Services (EMS) arrived. The baby began crying while Kepes was giving the caller instructions prior to EMS arrival indicating the baby started breathing again.

The EMD protocol used by Cumberland County Department of Public Safety allows dispatchers to do a rapid assessment of a medical emergency and provide detailed pre-arrival medical instructions to callers until first responders arrive. These instructions cover a wide range of medical emergencies including CPR, child birth and the Heimlich maneuver.
