Cumberland County Holiday Tree Arrives at Courthouse; Spruce Donated by Conservation District

Carlisle PA – The Cumberland County Conservation District today delivered the Cumberland County Courthouse Holiday Tree which was officially donated to the Cumberland County Board of Commissioners during a public meeting on Monday, Dec. 3.

The eight-foot Serbian Spruce, with dark green needles on its branches and white bands underneath create a silvery contrast to the look of the tree. The Holiday Tree, from Mountain View Nurseries, in Mechanicsburg was purchased with a portion of the proceeds of the Cumberland County's Conservation District seedling sale.

“For the past 41 years, the Conservation District has held a tree seedling sale and for the past three years, we have donated the tree for the Cumberland County Courthouse,” said Carl Goshorn, director of the Conservation District.

The Holiday Tree decorated with red, black and gray ornaments will be on display on the first floor of the courthouse beginning Monday, Dec. 10, from 8 a.m. until 4:30 p.m.
