Cumberland County Libraries Join Longwood Gardens' Community Read

Carlisle, PA – Cumberland County book and plant lovers are encouraged to participate in Longwood Gardens' 6th year of the Community Read, designed to encourage reading for pleasure and conversation. This year, the Community Read continues to journey into the science of the plant world by going back to where it all started-seeds.

For adult readers, the feature is "The Triumph of Seeds: How Grains, Nuts, Kernels, Pulses, & Pips Conquered the Plant Kingdom and Shaped Human History" by award-winning author Thor Hanson.

For younger readers, there are two features, "The Reason for a Flower," author Ruth Heller shares the story of plants and their functions. In "Seedfolks," author Paul Fleischman tells the story of a 9-year-old girl planting lima bean seeds that sparks 13 very different individuals to come together to create a community garden.
