### Cumberland County Commissioners Urge Residents to Comply with Updated Stay At Home Order

*Governor Extends Stay at Home Order Through May 8*

**Carlisle, PA** – The Cumberland County Board of Commissioners urge all residents to continue to abide by the updated Stay at Home Order after Governor Wolf extended the Order through Friday, May 8.

According to the [Stay at Home Order](#), “Non-life-sustaining physical business closures remain in effect and all life-sustaining businesses and state services will continue”

Individuals are permitted to leave their residences for tasks essential to maintaining health and safety.

Current visitation restrictions remain in place at the Cumberland County Prison and the county-owned Claremont Nursing and Rehabilitation Center.

Residents are not permitted in the Cumberland County Courthouse, county-owned buildings and facilities; however, offices are still operational with core personnel to continue daily operations. Court proceedings and court-related matters as specifically indicated by order of the President Judge of Cumberland County shall be conducted. The Court of Common Pleas of the 9<sup>th</sup> Judicial District, Cumberland County, and all Magisterial District Judges Offices are closed to the public until May 1 at 8 a.m. A re-evaluation of this measure will be made closer to May 1.

The Cumberland County Department of Public Safety’s Emergency Operations Center (EOC) has been activated since Saturday, Feb. 29, 2020 and will continue to monitor the situation.
