Primary Election is Tuesday June 2; Register to Vote by May 18

Carlisle, PA – Cumberland County residents who are not registered to vote, and who want to vote in the Primary Election on Tuesday, June 2 must register by Monday, May 18, 2020.

Residents can register to vote, or make changes to their registration by visiting the county Bureau of Elections Office, by mail or online at Cumberland County Bureau of Elections.

Residents who need an [absentee or mail-in ballot](#) must apply by Tuesday, May 26, and return ballots to the Bureau of Elections by Tuesday, June 2 by 8 p.m. Postmarks are not accepted.

Absentee Ballot:

Civilian voters can complete an application online using their PA Driver's License or PA Identification Card. This option is available now.

Absentee Ballot voting for Military and Civilians Overseas:

A Federal Post Card Application is for use by military members, their spouses & their dependents. This form serves as both an application for an absentee ballot and a registration form. This form can be used for more than one primary or election.

Mail-In Voting:

This form is for civilians wishing to vote by mail but do not qualify for an Absentee Ballot.

Deadline:

All voted absentee and mail-in ballots must be received in the Elections Office no later than 8 p.m. on the day of the primary or election. Postmarks are not accepted. Military ballots must be postmarked for return no later than the day prior to the primary or election and received in the Elections Office no later than the Tuesday following the primary or election.

In this Primary, Voters will be nominating their candidates for President, Attorney General, Auditor General, State Treasurer, Representative in Congress, Senator in the General Assembly, 31st & 33rd Districts, Representatives in the General Assembly, Delegates and Republican Committeeman/Committeewoman.

The Cumberland County Bureau of Elections maintains voter registrations, conducts elections, prepares official ballots and trains polling staff. The office is committed to providing clear and transparent voter services to Cumberland County residents.
