You may register to vote (or make changes to an existing record) at the Bureau of Elections Office during regular business hours between 8 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. at 1601 Ritner Highway, Suite 201, Carlisle

Last day to [register](#) before the election: **Monday, October 19.** *Postmarks will **not** be accepted.

Last day to *apply* for a [mail-in or absentee ballot](#): **Tuesday, Oct. 27.** *Postmarks will **not** be accepted.

Last day to *receive* or postmark voted [mail-in or absentee ballots](#): **Tuesday, Nov. 3 at 8 p.m.**
*Postmarked ballots **must be received** by 5 p.m. on Friday, Nov. 6.

In this General Election, voters will cast votes for President, Attorney General, Auditor General, State Treasurer, Representative in Congress, Senator in the General Assembly, 31st & 33rd Districts, and Representatives in the General Assembly.

The Cumberland County Bureau of Elections maintains voter registrations, conducts elections, prepares official ballots and trains polling staff. The office is committed to providing clear and transparent voter services to Cumberland County residents.
