A PennDOT meeting was held on Friday, July 30th. Kirk Stoner and some stakeholders from Perry County, Dauphin County and York County were in attendance and talked about the potential tolling and replacement of the I-83 Bridge, and the diversion of traffic.

Local Emergency Planning Committees: Cumberland County's local business are involved with the LEPC and are providing funds for the SARA Summit Meeting.

MH/IDD: Commissioner Foschi reported that Zach Hoopes's article in The Sentinel paper regarding MH/IDD was quoted very well.

Conservation District: Met July 27th.

- There was a record number of acres that have been tested for nitrogen. Interns have received credits for their 106 hours internship.
- Conservation District was audited by the Controller's office, the clean audit was forwarded to the state conservation commission.
- State conservation commission is providing our district with another \$100,000.00 dollars above what was received for the implementation of agricultural best management practices.
- Commission also conducted a program evaluation of the county's conservation districts nutrient management program.
- The PA Department of Agriculture is offering \$5,000.00 for conservation districts that would like to participate in the spotted lantern fly program.
